Supplier Inclusion Requirements & Commitments

As of October 2022, Sherwin-Williams project designs continue to evolve. Given the related increased construction costs we are pleased to share that the supplier dollar commitment has increased from \$180M to \$225M. To date, Sherwin-Williams has contracted a total of \$124M of the diverse supplier spend and is fully committed to meeting or exceeding our revised level of \$225M.

The actions and results from Sherwin-Williams deliberate approach to promoting economic equity on the Building our Future project speaks volumes. Our thoughtful and consistent approach to providing opportunities for businesses owned by underrepresented groups to participate in this project has already and continues to deliver an extensive list of impressive accomplishments which we expect to grow.

We are proud that we have already awarded contracts totaling \$124 million against a total commitment of \$225 million to Minority Business Enterprises (MBE), Female Business Enterprises (FBE) and Cleveland Small Businesses (CSB). We remain committed to helping uplift the entire Greater Cleveland community, including delivering on the supplier inclusion and diversity commitments asked of us by the state, county and city in our economic development packages.

Sherwin-Williams products cover the Hollywood Sign, which is 450 feet wide, and each letter stands 45' high and ranges between 31' and 39' wide, The Sign's color is Sherwin-Williams High Reflective White (SW7757).



The 36-story, global headquarters building in downtown Cleveland is designed to sway nearly 18" each way at the top during a major windstorm, and you still won't even feel it!

Project Status

Project Updates

On the HQ site, concrete and underground utility work continues. When the tower concrete foundation slab was poured, the pour began around 2:00 a.m. and continued through midafternoon as more than 150 truckloads of concrete were delivered. Large mechanical arms piped liquid concrete into every crack and crevice of the tower's foundation. Ground improvement activities have begun for the pavilion and garage. On the R&D site, foundation, structural concrete, and underground utility activities continue over multiple, low-rise buildings.

Procurement

While the overall design of both buildings has been developed, there is still work to be done on this three-year project, which is expected to be completed at the end of 2024. Click on the following links to view project timelines and procurement schedules.
