Our monthly Community Impact newsletter provides important updates about our <u>Building</u> <u>Our Future (BOF)</u> project which includes our new global headquarters in downtown Cleveland and our new global research & development (R&D) center in Brecksville, Ohio.

News

Supplier Inclusion Requirements & Commitments

As of October 2022, Sherwin-Williams updated its commitment to construction costs of \$750M to better reflect the updated design work related to the project. Given increased construction and project costs, we are pleased to share that the supplier dollar commitment has increased from \$180M to \$225M. To date, Sherwin-Williams has contracted a total of \$131M of the diverse supplier spend and is fully committed to meeting or exceeding our revised level of \$225M.

The awarded contracts for minority-owned, female-owned and small business construction and non-construction subcontractors, suppliers and service providers increased to 61 firms.

In 1982, Sherwin-Williams developed the Management Training Program (MTP), an accelerated leadership development opportunity designed to foster the Company's talent. It is still offered as part of the Company's career-building offerings 40 years later.

Project Status

Project Updates

On the HQ site, concrete and underground utility work continues. Ground improvement activities are underway for the podium and garage. On the R&D site, foundation, structural concrete and underground utility activities continue. On both sites, crew sizes are growing to support the multiple scopes of work progressing through the third quarter.

The project team continues to engage all parts of the workforce pipeline to reach crew ratios that keep the project on track for all workforce goals.

Procurement
